Minutes of the Cliburn Parish Meeting on 29th January 2025

1/25 - Apologies

2/25 - Present

5/25 - 2025/2026 Precept

The budget was discussed and the precept request of £3000.00 for 2025/26 was confirmed.

6/25 - Village lighting

Any lights on poles that are no longer in use will not be replaced. Lighting within the village at Firbank and Chapelhows will be removed. If the meeting feels that the lights should be retained or any new lighting, there needs to be information as to who is responsible, confirmation should be sought from the Council for funds. Note – currently there is not payment within the precept for any footway lighting. No additional or replacement lighting requirements were confirmed.

7/25 - Any other business

The defibrillator due to be installed at the bus stop has not yet been installed, there are problems with getting anything from Electricity Board, the issue being is getting power to the bus shelter. The machine and cabinet remains with Alan Chapelhow. Alan will continue discussions with Christian Westwell and the Electricity Board and attempt to identify other ideas for siting of the defibrillator.

Tim Wills raised the issue of the signs at the crossroad regarding weight restrictions on bridge, signs were supposed to be temporary. In the recent high winds the signage blew away and is now in field across the road. If the bridge is not going to be repaired soon, it was suggested that the request is made that the signs are made permanent, as they are dangerous in windy weather. Tim suggested that the Parish make a request for the signage be made permanent.

The 30MPH signage outside Greystones on the Bolton Road is now bent and twisted around, this should be reported and a request made to replace it.
